This academy is academically challenging even for the best of students. Finals weeks are tough especially when they have to juggle sports practices and trainings, possibly games and regimental duties. Be prepared to hear complaints and just listen – and remember it will blow over.

SPORTS NEWS

Academy varsity teams enjoyed one of their best weekends in winter sports history. The Men's Swimming Team earned their first victory over Coast Guard (157-143) since 1985, improving their dual meet record to 9-1. They were led by First Classman Jay Carpenter, who won three events, including an NCAA B-cut in the 100 Breaststroke, and Plebe Nick Halbach, who set the pool high board diving mark and made NCAA cuts for both the low and high boards.

The Men's Basketball squad put themselves squarely in the Landmark Conference playoff picture with home victories over Scranton and Moravian with a 4-3 conference record and 9-9 overall. The Lady Hoopsters continued its best start in history by upsetting Landmark leader Moravian College 58-57 in O'Hara Hall to go 11-6 overall and 3-4 in conference play.

The 19th-rank Wrestlers remained perfect in Centennial Conference competition at 5-0 with victories over Ursinus (21-12), conference champs past five years, Muhlenberg (38-5) and Stevens Tech (26-11). Plebes Jim Beshada and New England's own Vincent Renaut, 3/c Eric Vincent and Phil Greene were victorious in all three matches.

USMMA Mens Swimming and Diving completed its season on February 15-17 when the Landmark Championships were held at USMMA. The Men placed First and won the Landmark while the Women placed Sixth Overall. USMMA senior Jaquelyn Peterson and Plebe Nicholas Hallbach were named Landmark Divers of the Year after their First Place Finsh on both 1M and 3M. Congratulations to all.

The LaCrosse season opens on February 20th and it will be an exciting season for our Northern New England Midshipmen and Plebes who have made the USMMA LaCrosse Team. Plebe Scott Bridge, Plebe Jean Luc Gordon, Plebe Zachary Gray, Plebe Hunter Smith, MN Kevin Campbell and MN Keegan Boyle. This is a large group from our area. The Lacrosse team has joined a new athletic conference which unfortunately means that there will be no games in the Northern New England

area during the upcoming year. The closest game will be Union College in Schenectady NY (24 April), which about 3.5 hours from Boston. We will be watching for you and wish you great success.

ACADEMY GRADUATE PROGRAM ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

Engineering Graduates - Are you interested in advancing your professional status an engineer? Many practicing engineers find that an advanced degree in engineering is a very effective way to distinguish themselves and set the stage for professional growth and advancement.

The terminal degree is a Master of Science in Marine Engineering from the United States Merchant Marine Academy.

EM620, Marine Propulsion Systems (for non-ME or NA undergraduates)

Second Year Students

EM650, Internal Combustion Engine Analysis and New Technologies

EM623, Advanced Marine Materials

Third Year Students

EM625, LNG Vessel Operations and Design Considerations

EM632, Power Electronics

EM641, Management of Shipbuilding and Repair

The Academy is presently accepting applications for students interested in commencing the program in September 2008. The program is available to U.S. and international students. Admissions criteria and information on applying can be found on the MMarE web page noted above.

SPRING LEAVE

Winter Trimester Leave begins on Friday 29 February and runs thru Sunday 9 March. Plebes and Midshipmen are not to make travel plans in conflict with exam

schedules and may not depart until cleared by their company officer.

Spring Break ends on 9 March and all MIDN Officers must return to campus no later than 1200. Those MIDN who are returning from their sea terms (2009A) must report no later than 1200 on 9 March. All Plebes must be on campus at 1800 hours for their Plebe Knowledge Test. Please remember to not try to cut it to close – traffic is not an excuse for being late. This is also the beginning of Daylight Savings Time so Remember, Set your clocks ahead one hour.

Third Term Classes begin on Tuesday, 11 March.

TRAVEL PLANS

They will want to leave campus as soon as possible after the completion of their last exam and checkout. Try to make travel arrangements that accommodate their requests. There are a number of simple ways for the kids to return to Boston from NYC. For your convenience we have included the information below.

Chinatown Bus Services: *Due to popularity of chinatown bus, most buses will be very full, please make reservation ahead of time to guarantee your seat.

Midshipmen will take a taxi or bus or grab a ride from another midshipman from the Academy gate to the Long Island Railroad Station in Great Neck. They will take the LIRR to Penn Station NYC.

If they take Amtrak, that is where they catch their train. Amtrak runs 17 trains daily from NYC Penn Station to Boston South Station. This trip takes 4.5 hours for the regional service and the Acela (express) service takes 3.5 hours. The one advantage to taking the train is that they can hook up their computer and work on homework (upperclassmen) or watch movies or sleep while they travel home.

If they are taking the Fung Wah Chinese bus then they will follow the Subway directions here:

Take either B, or D to Grand St then walk two blocks south to Canal. Alternatively, take either 6, N, Q, R, J, M, Z to Canal St and walk 7-8 blocks east to the Bowery.

The Fung Wah Bus runs 18 buses daily from Chinatown NYC at 139 Canal Street to Chinatown Boston at 700 Atlantic Ave, South Station gate 25.

If they are taking the Travel Pack/Lucky Star Chinese bus then they will follow the Subway directions here:

Take either B, or D to Grand St then walk one block south to Hester. Alternatively, take either 6, N, Q, R, J, M, Z to Canal St and walk 7-8 blocks east to the Bowery, and one block north to Hester.

The Travel Pack/Lucky Star runs 15 buses daily from NYC at 69 Chrystie St. to Boston 700 Atlantic Ave, South Station gate 13.

Other Bus Services:

Boston Deluxe runs 3 buses Fri, Sat, Sun from 2 NYC Stops. Pickup/Dropoff #1 is the News Stand at 1250 Broadway, at 32nd St and Pickup/Dropoff #2: is the coffee shop at Second Ave, and E 86th St. The bus makes two stops one in Hartford, CT at the Charter Oak Supermarket at 365 Capitol Ave then one in Boston: at the Christian Science Plaza at 175 Huntington Ave.

LimoLiner runs 2-3 buses daily from NYC. The Pickup/Dropoff is at the Hilton New York, 1335 6th Ave (at 53rd St) with Pickup/Dropoff at Hilton Back Bay at 40 Dalton St (at Boylston St).

There are often Upperclassmen or parents who are willing to give rides to underclassmen – the only problem is timing often they will complete their final exams hours or even a day before.
